E. During the reporting period, the station employment unit engaged in the following initiatives:

Internship Program

Throughout the year, the employment unit operated an internship program designed to assist people acquire skills necessary for broadcast employment. Interns included:

A student from Pensacola Christian College worked as an intern in the SEU's programming department from May, 2008 through August, 2008.

A student from the University of Virginia worked as an intern in the SEU's programming department from June, 2008 through July, 2008.

A student from Akademi Bastad worked as an intern in the SEU's programming department from March 2, 2008 through the end of the reporting period.

Events sponsored by educational institutions related to broadcasting career opportunities

On March 24, 2008, the stations' operations manager gave a tour of the SEU's radio studios to approximately 15-20 students ages 4-12, from Heritage Christian Academy in Hermitage. The goal was to inform students of how a radio station works, and provide them with information that might help them determine whether broadcasting is a career that might be of interest. Tour included conversations with radio personalities, seeing a live broadcast and commercial production using some of the students or chaperones' voices.

On October 24, 2008 the SEU provided job shadowing opportunities to a senior at Nashville School of the Arts, a sophomore at Donelson Christian Academy, a senior at Mt. Juliet High School, an eighth grader at DuPont Hadley Middle School, a Junior at Martin Luther King Magnet School and an eighth grader at Meigs Magnet School.

On January 29, 2009, the SEU's operations manager gave a tour of the SEU's radio studios to 35 students from Brentwood Baptist K-6th grade. The goal was to inform the students of how a radio station works, and provide them with information that might help them determine whether broadcasting is a career that might be of interest. Tour included conversations with radio personalities and seeing their live broadcast.

On February 16, 2009, one of the units' morning air personalities welcomed nine members of Franklin Cub Scout Pack 188 to the studios. The goal was to inform the students of how a radio station works, and provide them with information that might help them determine whether broadcasting is a career that might be of interest. Tour included conversations with radio personalities

and seeing a live broadcast. Scouts also recorded a Public Service Announcement and each received their own copy of it. Announcement ran on the stations several weeks after that date.

On Saturday, February 21, 2009, one of the units' morning air personalities welcomed ten more members of Franklin Cub Scout Pack 188 – Den 7 to the studios. The goal was to inform the students of how a radio station works, and provide them with information that might help them determine whether broadcasting is a career that might be of interest. Tour included conversations with radio personalities and seeing a live broadcast. Scouts also recorded a Public Service Announcement and each received their own copy of it. Announcement ran on the stations several weeks after that date.

On February 24, 2009, the SEU's operations manager gave a tour of the SEU's radio studios to 37 students from Heart Homeschool Association. The goal was to inform the students of how a radio station works, and provide them with information that might help them determine whether broadcasting is a career that might be of interest. Tour included conversations with radio personalities and seeing their live broadcast.

On February 26, 2009 - participation by WFFH/WFFI morning show hosts in "Read Across America" week - an NEA Project (National Education Association). Read to classes at Bordeaux Elementary School in Nashville ... Read 2 stories to each class, answered questions about working in radio, how radio stations work, music, and being a DJ.

On March 16, 2009, the SEU's operations manager gave a tour of the SEU's radio studios to Cub Scout Den 5, Pack 339 from Smyrna. The goal was to inform the student scouts of how a radio station works, and provide them with information that might help them determine whether broadcasting is a career that might be of interest. Tour included conversations with radio personalities and seeing their live broadcast.

On March 16, 2009, the SEU's morning show personalities gave a tour of the SEU's radio studios to Wilson County Homeschoolers led by Rebecca Lowe. The goal was to inform the students of how a radio station works, and provide them with information that might help them determine whether broadcasting is a career that might be of interest. Tour included conversations with radio personalities and seeing their live broadcast.
